



Barrington Giving Day 2010 was held on Saturday December 11<sup>th</sup> at the Barrington Middle School, Station Campus.

Once again Barrington businesses and residents supported Barrington Giving Day in an outstanding way.

- **EXPENSES FOR GIVING DAY 2010** **\$77, 964.00**
- **NON CASH DONATIONS RECEIVED – NEW AND USED** **\$36,630.00**
- **TOTAL DOLLAR AMOUNT PROVIDED FOR GIVING DAY 2010** **\$114,595.00**

### **INVITATIONS**

Invitations were printed and donated by Barrington Print Shop.

- 1536 students  
797 families
- 781 invitations mailed.....
- 12 Hand Delivered
- -2 invitations returned students withdrew from school
- 6 families in district were not mailed invitations, but were eligible and came to BGD
- 797 Total families invited
  
- 781 families on the free and reduced lunch program were mailed Invitations.
- 355 Invited families attended Barrington Giving Day. (45%)
- 10 additional families from District served
- 66 families were served as walk-ins
- 444 families were mailed \$50.00 Jewel Food Cards
- 33 Senior Citizens were helped
- 102 Families at Greencastle were given food and a \$50.00 Jewel Food Card

TOTAL NUMBER OF FAMILIES & SENIORS HELPED BGD 2010 helped 1,010  
BGD 2009 helped 887 BGD 2008 helped 776 families.

## WINTER COATS, HATS AND GLOVES

Items collected throughout the Village were sorted at the Christian Science Church and taken to a SAM storage unit located in the parking lot of Station Middle School. Sorting Hats and gloves into sets and putting into plastic bags at the Church was time consuming but was great for Giving Day. Do this again for Giving Day 2011.

- Approximately 1000 used coats were collected **\$6,000.00**
- Residents donated 50 new children's coats **\$750.00**
- **771 winter coats for children were purchased by BGD at a cost of \$15,098. (\$19.58 per coat)**
- **88 new winter coats for children were purchased and donated by Barrington Bank and Trust \$1,320.00**
- Hats, gloves, scarves and mittens were collected **\$1,000.00**
- BGD purchased 600 hats and 300 pairs of ski gloves from Hong Kong **\$2,284.00**  
(These items were the first to be selected by the families)

## BOOKS

Barrington Middle School, Station Campus, collected, and purchased children's books. The books were sorted and packed by age and distributed to the families that attended.

- BGD purchased books from Barnes and Noble, Amazon and through Station Campus Middle School connections **\$2,640.00**
- Scholastic books donated books **\$600.00**
- New books and used books collected **\$750.00**
- BA United Way donated books **\$200.00**
- Over 3,000 books were collected and handed out.
- English/Spanish Bibles were donated and handed out to families who wanted one.

## TOYS

- BJWC purchased toys in the amount of **\$12,726.00**
- BGD purchased toys/gifts for teens **\$ 4,833.00**
- Station Middle School donated toys & gifts for teens **\$ 3,699.00**
- BA United Way purchased toys and gifts for teens **\$ 450.00**

**Total amount spent on toys and gifts for teenagers: \$21,708.00**

- In addition approximately 1,500 new and gently used toys were collected throughout Barrington. Learning Express donated a \$5,000.00 worth of new toys **\$8,200.00**

- BGD purchased new blankets
- **360** New Blankets were distributed to the families in attendance
- **BGD Spent on blankets** **\$4,320.00**
- **Barrington Residents donated 10 new blankets** **\$100.00**

## **GIFTS FOR SENIORS**

- 33 seniors from Cuba, Barrington Township Offices and BACO received \$50.00 Jewel Food Card, \$50.00 towards their NICOR Gas bill and a gift bag of cookies, crackers and hygiene products(Checks were made payable to Cuba Cares, Barrington Township Angel Fund, and BACOA to pay for the NICOR gas bill)
- 102 Families Residing at Greencastle received a \$50.00 Jewel Food Card and canned goods

## **FOOD AND HYGIENE PRODUCTS**

Barrington Lions Club raised money for paper products and reusable Trader Joe's bags.

- These bags worked great and I recommend we continue to use them for future Giving Days. Trader Joe's donated 180 bags and 180 bags were purchased.
- Local dentists donated toothbrushes
- 360 Hams were purchased from Milrose Packing... This year Milrose sold the hams to us for \$5.00 each, a saving of \$1,800.00
- BGD purchased food **\$8,842.00**
- Coffee donated by Station Middle School teachers **\$900.00**
- Barrington Residents donated canned goods **\$1,000.00**
- Barrington Lions Club donated paper products **\$1,500.00**
- BGD purchased Hygiene products **\$1,229.00**
- Local Dentist donated Toothbrushes etc **\$954.00**
- Hams **\$1,800.00**
- Jewel Food Cards **\$21,133.00**
- Trader Joe Bags **\$180.00**
- Truck Rental to deliver food to School **\$158.00**
- Baby formula was purchased by BGD **\$ 371.00**
- Baby formula and diapers collected **\$1,000.00**

I spoke with a number of families who attend Giving Day about the contents of the food boxes to be sure we are giving the families what they need. They unanimously agreed that contents of the foods boxes, gifts, coats books etc were more than they expected and are grateful to everyone.

### **BOXES**

- 52 Donation Boxes were decorated and distributed to various businesses, schools and churches

Adco Van (Brian Dockery) provided all cardboard boxes for the food and the donation boxes throughout the Village.

### **Salvation Army**

The Salvation Army provided liability insurance for Barrington Giving Day. Without Liability Insurance we would not be able to use the school as a distribution point for Barrington Giving Day.

Left over items were picked up by the Salvation Army after Giving Day from Station Middle School (from the Sam unit). This procedure worked very well. The Salvation Army picked up items that we could not use from the Christian Science Church. (Twice a week)

As always the volunteers were outstanding. Especially the Barrington High School Football Club, Wrestling Teams, Spanish Club, and many other High School Students worked so hard. They were enthusiastic and willing to help in an outstanding way.
